During the past couple of months, Newtown Arts Company has been monitoring the situation; keeping abreast of current social distancing guidelines and suggested best practices. While we hope the government, mandated restrictions will soon begin to lift, we still do not have clarity on how the “opening up” will roll out.

Regardless, our main concern moving forward will be providing a safe environment for our performers, production staff, volunteers, and you – our patrons and supporters. Although it was a difficult decision, we believe the best course of action at this point in time is to cancel our 2020 Season. Our intent is to lift and shift our slate of productions to 2021. In that regard, we are working to secure rights and dates for:

- The Wedding Singer
- Steel Magnolias
- Matilda: The Musical
- Laughter on the 23rd Floor
- Rodgers & Hammerstein’s Cinderella

Those 5 shows, plus our Classic’s for Kids would make up our 2021 Season.

For current 2020 ticket holders, you have 3 options:

- a. Consider making the 2020 ticket purchase a donation to Newtown Arts Company.
- b. Roll over 2020 Tickets to 2021 performances once the 2021 Season is set.
- c. Request a Refund

If you have purchased tickets, you will receive a separate communication from Newtown Arts Company with more details.

Additionally, we will not be able to hold our Stars of Tomorrow Summer camp this July. If you have registered, your fees will be refunded. We expect to offer this popular program in the summer of 2021 and look forward to working with your children again.

While live theatre will not be produced for the balance of the year, Newtown Arts Company is exploring how we can keep theatre alive in Bucks County. Keep your eyes open for upcoming announcements to help you keep connected with theatre until we can once again perform for you. In the meantime, thank you for your continued support of Newtown Arts Company and Stay Safe.
